


# MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS: CHURCH PARTNERSHIPS

### LOVE NORTHEAST DENVER


Through 2020 and 2021, our Love Northeast Denver initiative helped hundreds of families in our neighborhood through the unique and acute challenges of a global pandemic.


